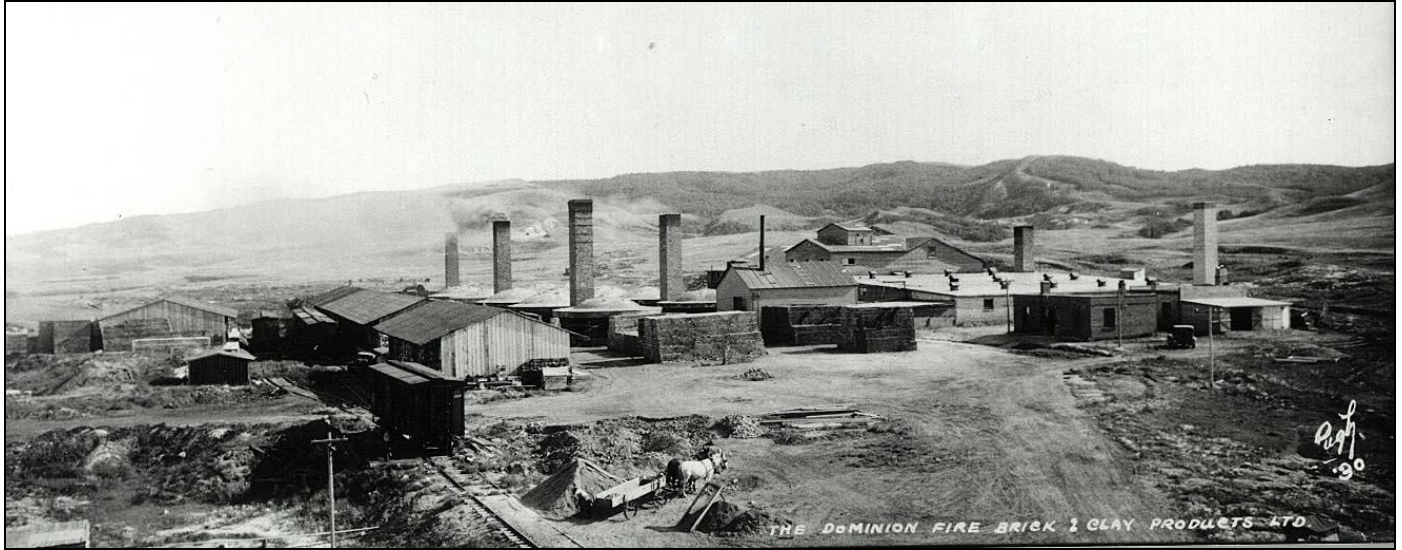
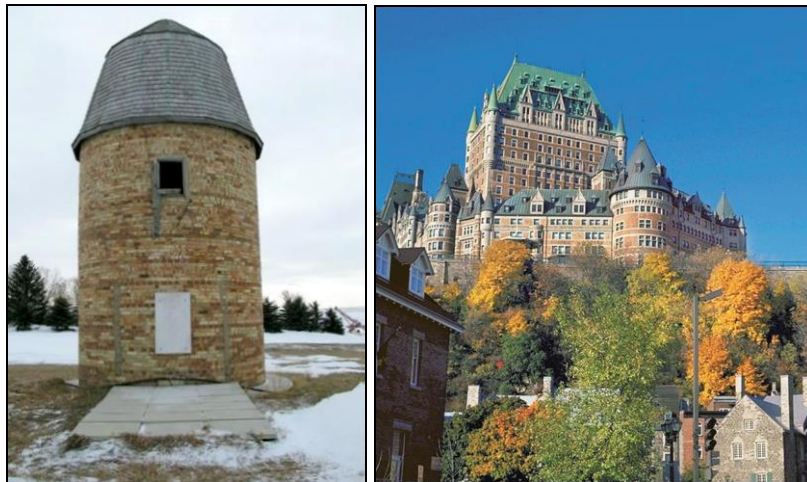

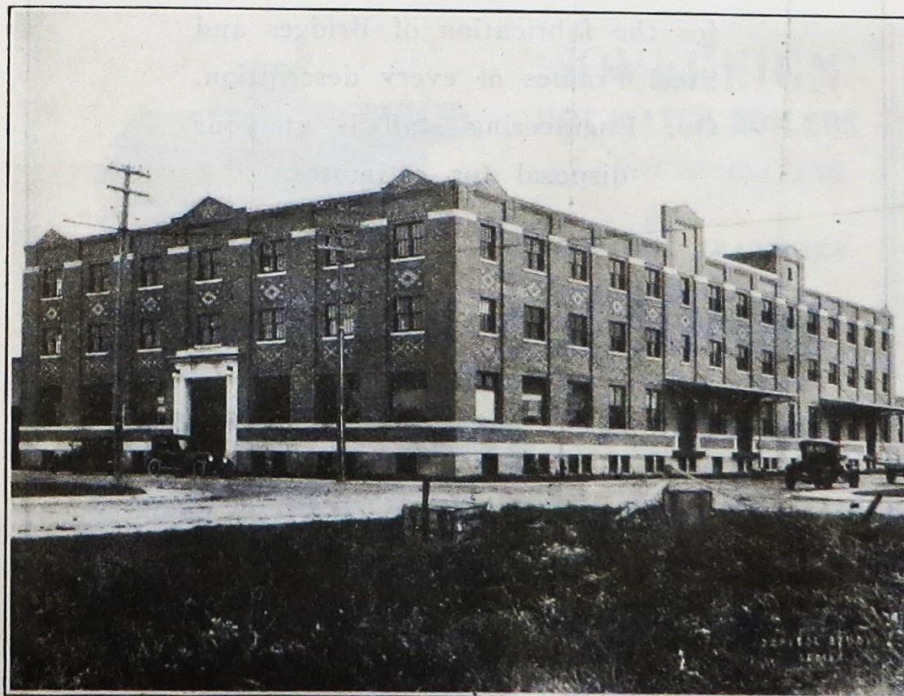

Introduction:

The purpose of this document is to provide a listing of all known buildings and structures in Canada that were made in whole or in part with bricks manufactured at the Claybank Brick Plant, Saskatchewan. This Inventory, consisting of over 350 buildings and structures, is mainly focused on face brick, but also includes common brick, generally known as filler brick, which is primarily used as fill behind face brick or for un-exposed interior walls. Claybank was also a major producer of refractory brick (also known as fire brick), which was mostly used for structures exposed to extremely high temperatures, like kilns, fire boxes for boilers, and smelters. This listing does not include buildings and structures that incorporate fire brick.

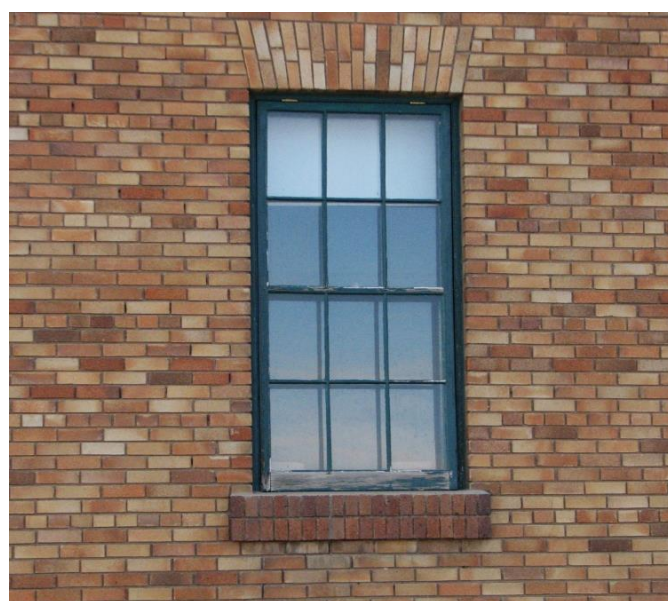
Both the Canadian and Saskatchewan governments instituted “Buy Canadian” and “Buy Saskatchewan” product programs during the 20th century, and hence the brick manufacturing industry in Saskatchewan – especially that located at Claybank and Estevan, was particularly fortunate for that opportunity to stabilize or improve business. These programs were partly instituted to lesson fire hazards for buildings, by reducing the number of highly flammable wood frame buildings erected in the downtown core areas. In addition, during World War II (1939-1945), the federal government’s “Home Front” programs were beneficial to brick factories across Canada (like Claybank) that made fire bricks for train, ship and air force base boiler systems, as well as smelter plants.

The three primary types of face bricks made at Claybank include:

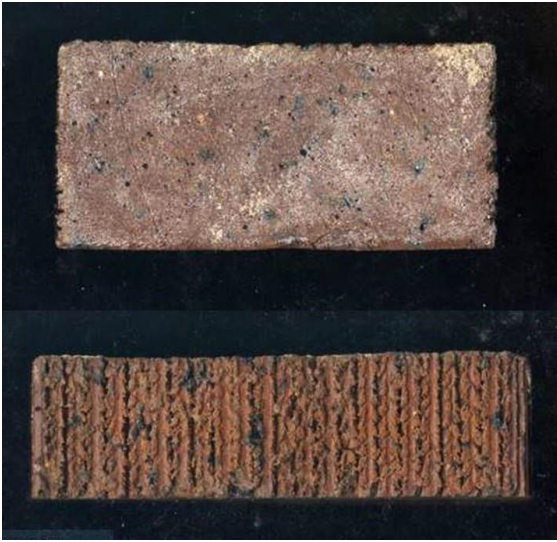

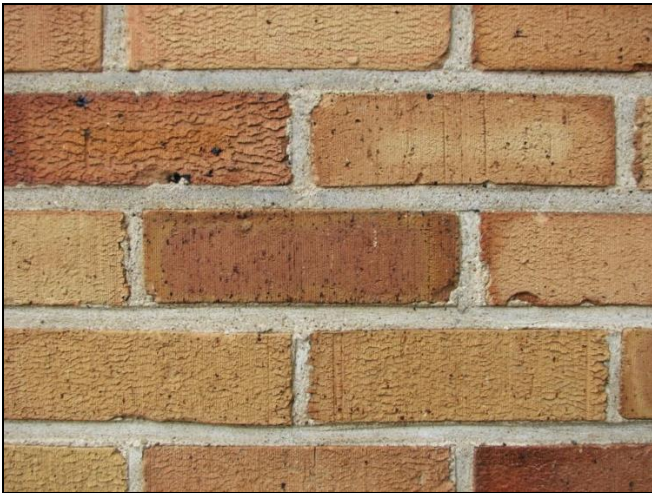

At this time, only about a dozen buildings have been located that incorporated Tapestry brick in their design.

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Discontinuance of Face Brick:

Archives File: F-242 – Greater Winnipeg Water District – Addition.

In the late 1940s, Claybank management decided not to make face brick for new buildings (not sure if this applied everywhere or only outside Saskatchewan), unless this was for an addition to a building originally faced with Claybank brick. I expect that this was only a temporary directive, as other Claybank records indicate that

face brick was discontinued permanently in the mid 1960s, after A.P. Green Refractories Ltd., based out of Mexico, Missouri, took over *de facto* control of the business:

File: F-242: Letter from C.M Thompson of the Winnipeg Supply & Fuel Company, to H.A. Goodman, Manager of Dominion Fire Brick & Clay Products Ltd. (i.e. Claybank Brick Plant), dated July 6, 1949:

“ I told the architects that you are not catering to new buildings, as you are so busy with Fire Brick, but you always had been, and still are, willing to make brick for additions to buildings where your brick was originally used, and that he need not have any worry about your ability, or willingness, to furnish Face Brick for this addition. . . ”

Other Brick Sources:

In Saskatchewan, face brick was made at dozens of small local plants, but only at three large facilities – located at Bruno, Claybank and Estevan. Bruno bricks tend to have more of an orange colour to them, while Estevan bricks varied greatly, including red, which was generally not produced extensively elsewhere except at Moose Jaw and Prince Albert, and at a few smaller plants. In addition, face bricks were imported into Saskatchewan from brick factories in other provinces and even some from the United States. Estevan’s rough textured bricks (Ruff-Tex) were very similar to Claybank’s Ruf-Tex bricks, but lacked the tell-tale black iron flecks. The Assiniboia Court House – faced with Estevan bricks – is an excellent example of that similarity.

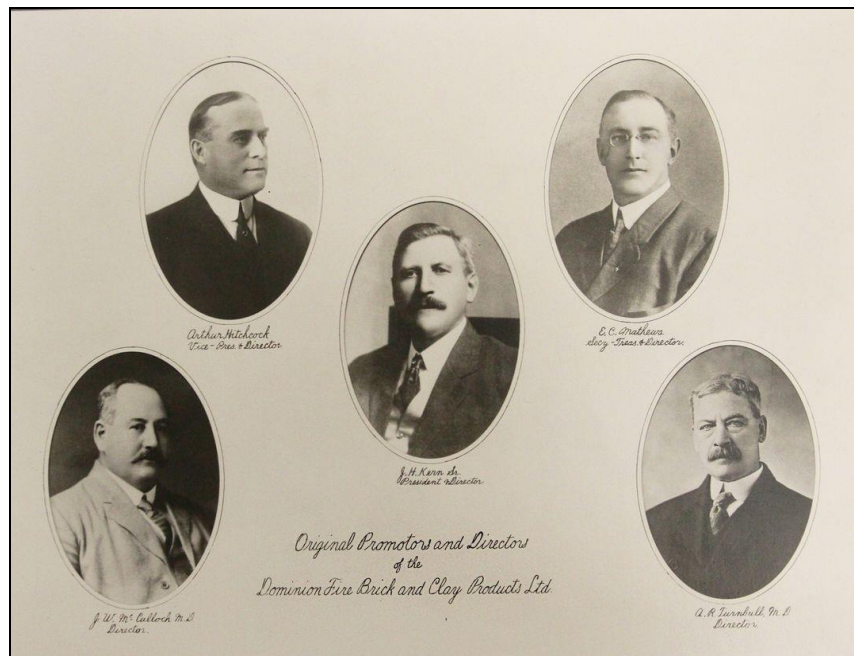

The five Moose Jaw businessmen who founded the Dominion Fire Brick and Clay Products Company in 1912 also financed construction and operation of the Claybank Brick Plant. By June 16, 1913, a year before the onset of World War I, they produced their first run of “Claybank face bricks”. However, soon after War was declared in August 1914, building construction severely slowed down throughout

Canada. Staff at the Brick Plant began to enlist, and the Plant's operation shut down until 1916, when the company resumed production. It then operated continually until 1989.

- 13. A Key Claybank Brick Characteristic:** All Claybank-made face bricks contain black flecks – caused by iron impurities in the clay. Therefore, if a building has the tell-tale black flecks in its face bricks, but was built before June 1913, then it was not made with Claybank bricks.
- 14. Brick Colour:** Claybank bricks range in colour from very light beige (almost white) to dark brown. No **red bricks** were ever deliberately manufactured at Claybank.
- 15. Conversion from Coal to Natural Gas:** In late 1960 and early 1961, six of the two round downdraft kilns were converted from coal firing to natural gas firing. This was a cleaner and more efficient way to burn bricks, but it also resulted in a lighter shade of T.P. Moka and Ruf-Tex brick. In spite of extensive testing in the Laboratory, the new gas fired bricks could not be made with the traditional darker colours. Consequently, when additions were made to pre-1960 buildings faced with Claybank bricks, the Claybank Brick Plant was unable to exactly match the brick colour for the additions. This problem cost the Company some sales, but made it easy for architectural historians to readily identify post-1960 additions to those buildings.

- 16. Brick Identification:** Some identification in this Inventory still needs to be verified. As a Twin Cities brick made at Grand Forks, North Dakota is very similar to Claybank's T.P. Moka, some of the buildings identified as being faced with Claybank brick may actually be faced with bricks from the American factory. Also, as noted above, Estevan Brick manufactured face brick similar to that made at Claybank, but the black flecks found in Claybank bricks do not exist in the Estevan products.
- 17. Photo / Image Size:** Due to the high volume of images in this document, photos have generally been reduced to about 100 to 250 KB, and often have been cropped, lightened or darkened to fit the format for the Inventory.
- 18. PAS and SHF Photo Credits:** Many of the slides taken by me and my colleagues at the provincial government's Heritage Branch between 1979 and 2000 have been transferred to the Provincial Archives of Saskatchewan (PAS), and are listed as follows in this report: **PAS Accession: 2010-211**, followed by the name of the photographer, and the date of the photograph. These images are "research quality"

copies. For higher quality copies, please contact the PAS to see the original slides. In addition, a number of print images were taken while we were assigned to work at the Saskatchewan Heritage Foundation from about 1997 until 2004. Those are listed as: **SHF**, followed by the name of the photographer, and the date of the photograph.

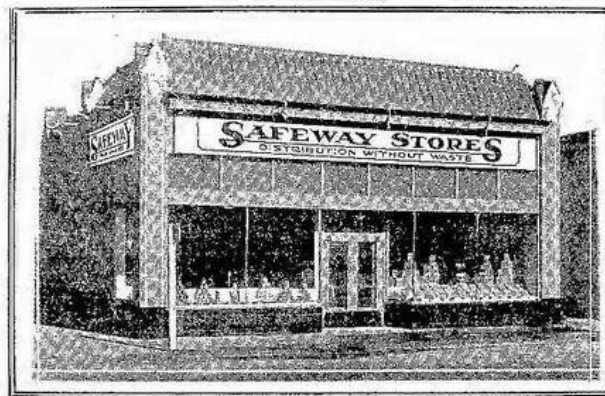
19. Addresses: Where addresses are taken from Google street views, they may be approximate, unless they can be discerned on the building. Corrections are most welcome.

20. “Archives File: F - ____”: This refers to the Provincial Archives of Saskatchewan – SAFA 01 – *A Guide to the Records of the Claybank Brick Plant fonds*. These files are for customer orders: “F” = face brick; “FB” = fire brick, and often identifies the buildings made with Claybank brick.

21. Federal Buildings / Post Offices – A substantial number of these buildings were faced with Claybank brick during the 1930s, 40s and 50s. A listing of these buildings is appended to the end of this report, for further examination.

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The Safeway Invasion



The Classic and most popular Safeway Store design in Western Canada

In the fall of 1928 Safeway Stores Ltd., based out of California, announced that it would build over 1,000 grocery stores throughout Western Canada, at a total cost of about \$8 million, with between 400 and 500 stores to be located in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia within the next three years. It has not yet been determined if that total price included merchandise, or where and how many Safeway stores were built in each province. Nor was there any indication of where the bricks for these almost identical stores would be manufactured. What is known, is that a number of the 30 or so Saskatchewan stores were faced with Ruf-Tex and T.P Moka brick made at Claybank. Those stores are included in this Inventory.

That said, if Safeway bought all of their bricks from Claybank, than this would make the Safeway company the largest non-government or railway client for the Claybank factory in terms of the number of buildings that feature Claybank products. Much of the construction started in late 1929, just a few months before the start of the Great Depression. That event likely resulted in a curtailment of Safeway’s initial grandiose scheme. While Canadian banks and railway companies also built hundreds of structures throughout Saskatchewan, not all were of brick, as was the case for the initial Safeway stores. Later, Safeway stores were faced with stucco.

Currently the location of 29 Safeway-built stores and two Safeway-rented warehouses have been confirmed, in the following Saskatchewan communities:
