POSITION: Educational Program Facilitator

The Manitoba Historical Society was founded in 1879 and is the oldest organization in western Canada devoted to the promotion and preservation of Manitoba's historical resources. Our Mandate is to encourage research and publications relating to the history of Manitoba, to promote and encourage public interest in Manitoba and Canadian History, to foster preservation of property relating to history of Manitoba, to assist in the formation of historical societies, and to work with them in furthering the objectives of the Society throughout Manitoba. The Society owns and operates Dalnavert Museum, a designated national historic site, and former home of Sir Hugh John Macdonald, son of the first Prime Minister of Canada, Sir John A. Macdonald. The Society also operates Ross House Museum, the restored home of William Ross, who was appointed postmaster in 1855 by the Council of Assiniboia and whose home served as the first post office in western Canada. The Society publishes a history journal, newsletters, offers a variety of history-related programs, sponsors various heritage and book awards, and offers lectures and historic tours.

The Manitoba Historical Society is currently seeking volunteers to facilitate the curriculum-based educational programs being offered at the Dalnavert Museum.

These programs will be offered on Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays from January to June in two time slots: 10 am and 1 pm. Programs will run approximately 90 minutes in length, plus an optional lunch break. Educational Program Facilitators will be expected to:

- engage students in active, site-specific learning
- provide interpretive tours of the museum
- deliver program lessons and activities to student groups
- prepare materials for program activities
- set up and take down tables and chairs
- supervise lunch break
- clean up after activities/lunch
